- Regular tests and exams are conducted where evaluation is done and grades are allotted, based on which internal marks are awarded.
- Students are encouraged to give seminars with or without using ICT. Students were asked to write assignments. Experts were called to give lecturers for students how to face examination and get success in them.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- Three of the staff members have Guide ship.
- The teachers publish articles, edited books, written books without/with ISBN numbers.
- Major and Minor projects by the UGC teachers association.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- New books were purchased during the year.
- New dailies, magazines and journals were subscribed.
- 80% the classrooms, Library and corridors are equipped with CCTV cameras.
- There is separate ICT room which is used by all departments and two mobile LCDs which is used for seminars and conducting classes.
