The feedback from the students are been taken from the students to sustain the quality of education.
- 3) Quality enhancement is taken care by the methods like regular unit tests, internals, assignments, seminars, preparation of charts and industrial visits etc.
- 4) Guest lectures are conducted by the eminent personality from the field of academics and corporate to give more knowledge.

Weakness:

- 1) Quality of the students admitted to the course is below average.
- 2) The socio-economic background of many of the students (some of them are first and second generation learners) admitted in the College is responsible for poor language competence (both in their mother tongue as well as English). This leads to an unsatisfactory level of comprehension and communication, particularly in the first two semesters.

Opportunities:

- 1) Improved quality characteristics of student body
- 2) To focus on Continuous improvement
- 3) To introduce more number of job oriented and skill development, self employed courses and other emerging subjects

Threats:

1) To motivate students to develop a deeper level of critical and analytical thinking and to cultivate in them an endeavouring passion to pursue higher education.
